TELL THEM FROM ME SURVEYS

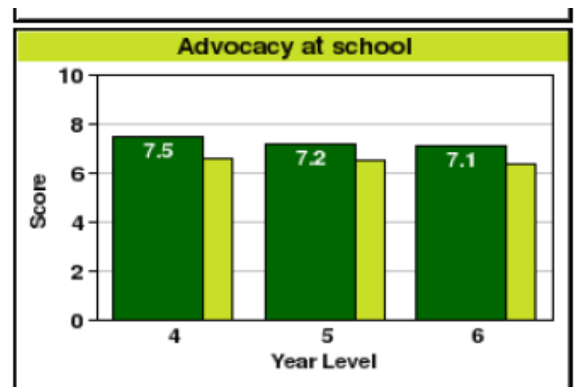
In the last couple of weeks our students, staff and community have had the opportunity to have their say in an on-line survey called the 'Tell Them from Me' surveys. I have included in my report a sample of these graphs that paint a very clear picture of our happy school. They tell a story of **well-supported students** who have a **wide range of opportunities** and who consequently **behave well**. Importantly it also shows a **high level of intellectual engagement**.

PRIMARY RESULT

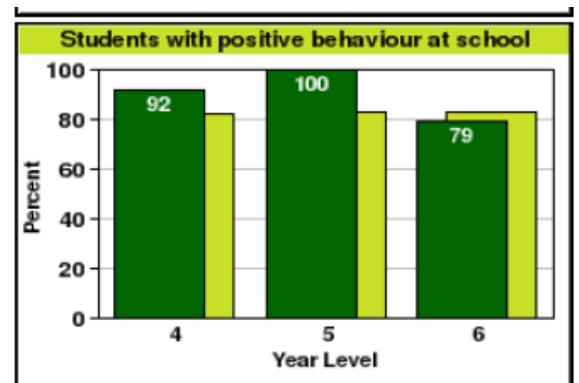
Advocacy at school

- Students feel they have someone at school who consistently provides encouragement and can be turned to for advice.
- In this school, students rated Advocacy at School 7.2 out of 10; the NSW Govt norm for these years is 6.5.
- In this school, Advocacy at School was rated 6.7 out of 10 by girls and 7.8 out of 10 by boys. The NSW Govt norm for girls is 6.5 and for boys is 6.4.



Students with positive behaviour at school

- Students that do not get in trouble at school for disruptive or inappropriate behaviour.
- In this school, 90% of students had positive behaviour; the NSW Govt norm for these years is 83%.
- 90% of the girls and 91% of the boys in this school with positive student behaviour at school. The NSW Govt norm for girls is 91% and for boys is 75%.

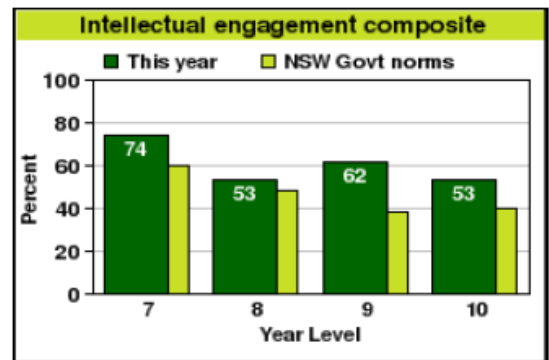

Intellectual engagement composite

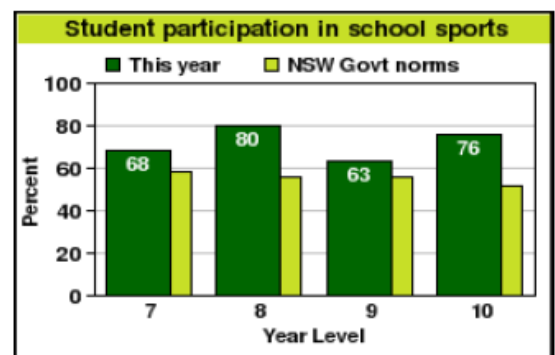
- Students are intellectually engaged and find learning interesting, enjoyable, and relevant.
- 62% of students in this school are intellectually engaged. The NSW Govt norm for these year levels is 46%.
- 47% of the girls and 73% of the boys in this school were intellectually engaged. The NSW Govt norm for girls is 43% and for boys is 49%.



Social-Emotional Outcomes

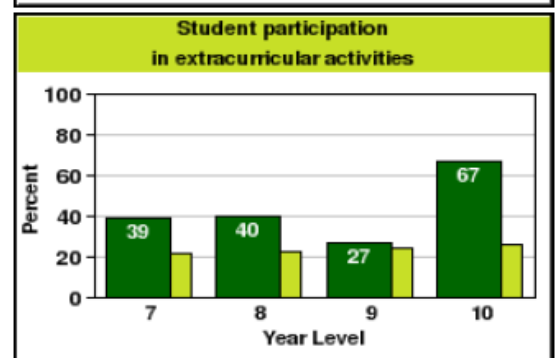
Student participation in school sports

- Students play sports with an instructor at school, other than in a gym class.
- 71% of students in this school had a high rate of Participation in Sports; the NSW Govt norm for these years is 56%.
- 73% of the girls and 70% of the boys in this school had a high rate of Participation in Sports. The NSW Govt norm for girls is 54% and for boys is 58%.



Student participation in extracurricular activities

- Students take part in art, drama, or music groups; extracurricular school activities; or a school committee.
- 43% of students in this school had a high rate of Participation in Extracurricular activities; the NSW Govt norm for these years is 24%.
- 37% of the girls and 47% of the boys in this school had a high rate of Participation in Extracurricular activities. The NSW Govt norm for girls is 26% and for boys is 21%.

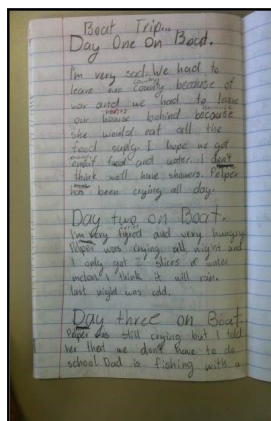
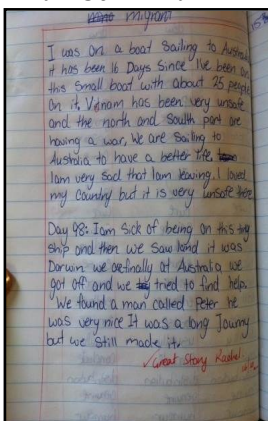
