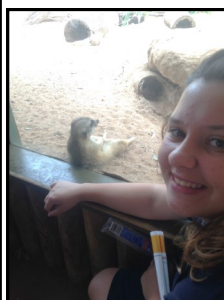

Our 7/8 Technology class had the opportunity to visit Taronga Western Plains Zoo last Thursday as part of their exhibit design unit. On that day it had been arranged for the boys to take part in a good yarn in the company of councillors, a Juvenile Justice Officer, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community Police Liaison Officer and a Community Corrections Officer. We look forward to a strong partnership with Headspace Dubbo and we would like to thank Nic, Kevin, Ashley and Brendan for their insight and sharing of knowledge to promote positive wellbeing and lifestyle choices for our students, the headspace information packs and lunch. 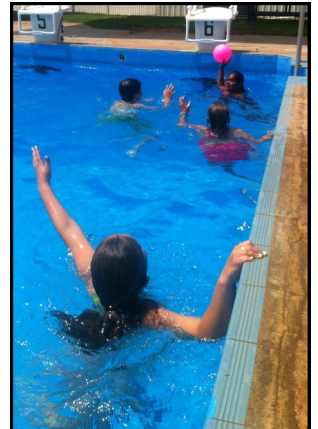
### School Swimming Program

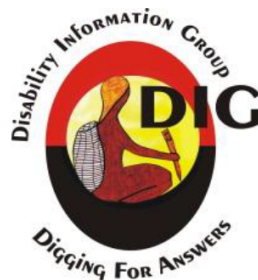
