SCHOOL canteen menus are set for an overhaul amid revelations that many serve junk food to children, including lollies, cakes and soft drinks, in defiance of health guidelines set more than a decade ago.

As an obesity crisis sweeps through the state's schools, nutrition experts are pushing for a carrot and stick approach to force schools to

improve the healthy food options they offer students.

They want schools that run healthy canteens to receive extra funding or "gold star" status, and those that serve junk food to be punished.

Leading nutritionists and the Healthy Kids Association, a key stakeholder in the fight against obesity, believe schools have failed to enforce standards and will push for a

new regimen.

They say the traffic light guide to food groups — green (always allowed), amber (select carefully) and red (not recommended) — has not been policed strictly enough, especially in hundreds of canteens outsourced to private operators.

"We need a monitoring and compliance program or it will not work," Healthy Kids CEO Jo Gardner said.

"It is about rewarding good ...

practice and having consequences for those schools that still sell soft drinks or sell poor quality food."

In one of the state's heaviest regions, Western Sydney, students at several high schools — including Quakers Hill, Evans and Mitchell — can get their fat-fix at an in-house build-your-own "burger bar" with the option of adding extra cheese or bacon to super-size their lunch.

The high-fat lunch option can be washed down with a juice, sports drink, "slushie" — or a hot coffee.

Students at Dungog High in the Hunter Valley can snap up a pluto pup or potato scallop for lunch and treat themselves to a custard tart, vanilla slice or finger bun for dessert.

In the state's Far West, where the obesity epidemic is at its worst, students can order a large slushie, chocolate mousse, potato chips, finger bun and opt to add additional cheese to their hot dog at Broken Hill's Railway Town Public School.

Healthy Kids Association school programs manager Clare Knight said most of these items simply should not be on canteen menus.

The results of an inquiry into school canteen food led by the NSW Department of Education including new rules for healthy food are expected to be released early next year.

Last year, 386 schools licensed their canteens generating income of \$5.64 million, department figures show. But a large number of canteens have been found to ignore bans on sugar-sweetened drinks and fat-

laden offerings. Meat pies, sausage rolls, pizza, chips and ice creams are also common fare despite the war on obesity.

"Little is being done at school level and many products do not meet standards," Ms Gardner said. "We want food literacy integrated into the curriculum in every school."

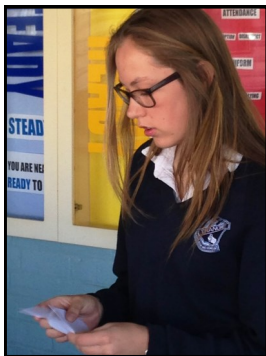

### Captain's Speeches

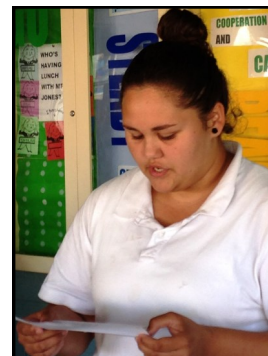

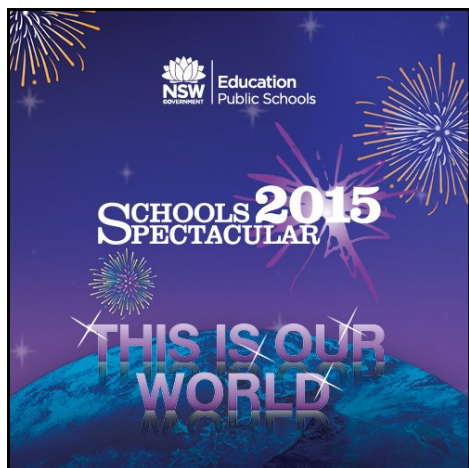
