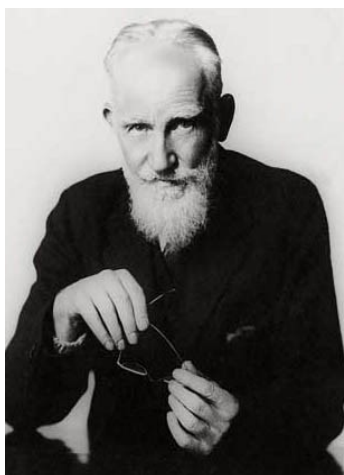
# FROM THE PRINCIPAL

# TCS 2015 Fete

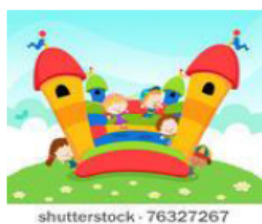


*Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> October from 3pm*
