## NAIDOC WEEK

NAIDOC week is upon us next week when we take the opportunity to pay respect to our Aboriginal culture. Our school has 215 students, 95 of whom identify as Aboriginal therefore recognising who we are, celebrating who we are and being proud of who we are is essential.

Cultural knowledge, understanding and pride have grown steadily in our school, and have gathered momentum as the years have gone by. Our dance, creative arts and Wiradjuri language program have all contributed to whole school respect and celebration of culture. Our Bro Speak and Sista Speak programs develop self-esteem and encourage aspirations for the future. Our students are able to stand tall and be proud of who they are, no matter what their background is. This is exemplified by the number of students, both boys and girls who participate so enthusiastically in everything that is offered, with twelve places gained at Schools Spectacular this year and ten students accepted into the Bangarra Rekindling program. I was never so proud as when Pat Skinner stood and spoke so eloquently about the importance of culture at our school, when we were invited to dance at the Wudhagaragarra Awards in Dubbo. NOW we have primary students beginning the journey after their Aboriginal Dance Workshop last week in Coonamble and they will be dancing at our assembly on Monday. They are so excited and so am I!!!

### **Science Exam**

Just to let parents know that the former annual ESSA online Science examination has changed to **VALID**; this stands for Validation of Assessment 4 Learning and Individual Development. **VALID** is building on the success of ESSA and is now going to provide a suite of online multimedia diagnostic assessments for Stages 3 to 5 in the Science KLA. **ESSAonline** is being replaced by **VALID Science 8** and **VALID Science 10**. The structure and delivery of **VALID Science 8** and **VALID Science 10** will be similar to **ESSAonline** 2014. It is compulsory for all students to sit these tests. Each student needs to bring headphones or earbuds that plug into a school computer. Earbuds for an iPod or portable player are suitable.

We took 4 steers over, 3 Angus (Fergie, Dozer and Duke) and one Angus x Hereford (Panda). We met at the cattle yards at 5:30am to get the steers haltered and loaded onto the trailers along with all of the show gear. A huge thank you to Kelly Milliner for the loan of the horse float, and also to Scott Brown and Mark Haines for driving.

We arrived at Peak Hill at 8:00am with our first class of showing to start at 10:00am. This gave the team, which consisted of many new students, plenty of time to wash and prepare the steers as well as dress in our show uniform. Our first competition was the Led Steer which involved the judging of the animal; Meegan Seymour led Fergie, Hamish Corcoran with Dozer, John Apap with Panda and Taylah Brown with Duke. TCS was awarded a 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and a 5<sup>th</sup> in this Heavy Weight section, competing against other schools and studs.

Junior Judging commenced next where students had to assess four heifers against criteria important for beef production and hand in their results to be reviewed over lunch. A luncheon was generously provided by the Peak Hill Show. Following this, members of the Cattle Team competed in Paraders which involved the handler being judged. Ben Skinner and Geoffrey Lewis entered the Novice Class, Hamish Corcoran and Luke Broughton in the Under 15's. Up next Morgan Gale and Meegan Seymour competed in the first 15-18's heat, then Taylah Brown and John Apap in the second. John made it through to the final heat and received 4<sup>th</sup> place overall.

Special thanks to Scott, Mark and Kate Broughton for assisting on a very successful show day! It was a great opportunity for our experienced team members to guide new students, all of which represented the school with pride. Congratulations!

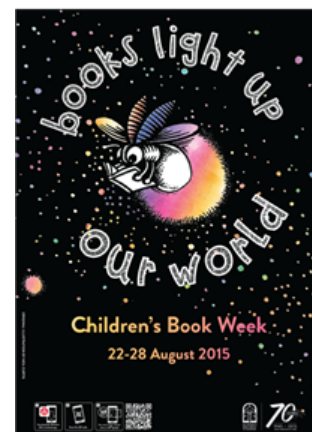
## Assistant Principals' Report

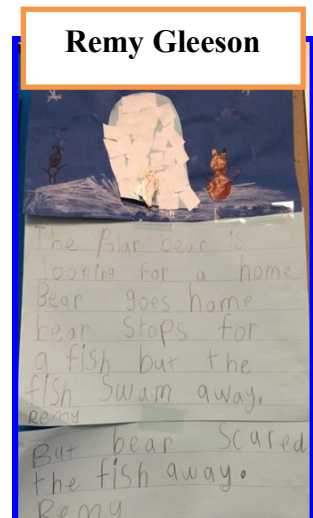
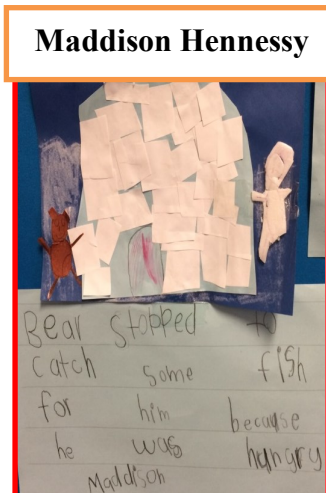
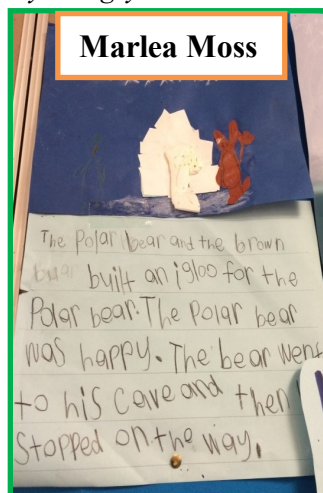

## Dietary guidelines: children 4-8 years

### Daily dietary guidelines for children 4-8 years



Children need a **wide variety of healthy foods** from each of the five food groups. How much food children need depends on body size and activity levels.



Children aged 4-8 years should aim for 1½ serves of fruit; 4½ serves of vegies; 1½-2 serves of dairy; 4 serves of bread, cereals and grains; and 1½ serves of meat.



Children need plenty of **water**—the cheapest, healthiest and most thirst-quenching drink. They need more water on hot or humid days and if they sweat a lot. Avoid soft drinks, fruit juices, flavoured milk and water, sports drinks and energy drinks.

### Food groups: daily serves of fruit, vegetables, cereals and grains



**Fruit:** 1 serve = 1 medium apple, banana, orange or pear; or 2 small plums, kiwi fruits or apricots; or 1 cup diced or canned fruit (no added sugar).



**Vegetables:** 1 serve = ½ a medium potato or other starchy vegies (sweet potato, corn); or ½ cup cooked vegies (broccoli, spinach, carrots, pumpkin); or 1 cup green leafy or raw salad vegies; or ½ cup cooked, dried or canned beans, or lentils.



**Cereal and grains:** 1 serve = 1 slice of bread; or ½ cup cooked rice, pasta, noodles, quinoa or polenta; or ½ cup porridge; or 2/3 cup wheat cereal flakes; or ¼ cup muesli; or 1 crumpet, small English muffin or scone.

### Food groups: daily serves of dairy, protein, and 'sometimes' foods



**Dairy:** 1 serve = 1 cup (250 ml) milk (reduced fat or calcium-fortified soy milk); or 2 slices cheese; or ¾ cup (200 gm) yoghurt; or ½ cup ricotta cheese.



**Meat, fish, poultry, eggs, nuts, legumes:** 1 serve = 65 gm cooked lean beef, lamb, veal or pork; or 80 gm cooked lean chicken or turkey; or 100 gm cooked fish fillet; or 170 gm cooked tofu; or 2 large eggs; or 1 cup cooked lentils, chickpeas or canned beans; or 30 gm peanuts, almonds or sunflower seeds.



**'Sometimes' foods:** foods with high levels of fat, sugar and salt (cakes, biscuits, chips and fried foods) aren't recommended. You can use a small amount (7-10 gm) unsaturated spreads or oils for cooking.
