The students will meet with the students from other Access schools and participate in study sessions and assessment tasks as well as having some time to get to know each other.

I have been incredibly impressed with the attitude of the senior group this year and I know that it is the beginning of very exciting things to come for our school.

Head Teacher Teaching and Learning Appointment

On Monday afternoon we conducted interviews in search of the right person for our school in this vital role. The panel, consisting of Mr Troy Jones, Ms Jessica Skinner, Mr Phil Rufus (Narromine HS) and Mrs Amanda Kater (your community representative) worked hard to find a person who would suit our school's needs.

We were very pleased to offer the job to Mrs Kate Wilson who accepted the offer, (10 day appeal period ending next week). Mrs Wilson teaches at Merewether Selective High School at present and brings to our school experience and expertise in teaching English across all stages and particularly HSC Advanced and Extension English. It is very exciting to know that we have enhanced the capability in our school to cater for all levels of ability from those needing extra support to those needing extension. Hopefully, Mrs Wilson will join us in Term 2.

IPROWD (Indigenous Police Recruitment Our Way Delivery)

Last Thursday I was honoured to receive an invitation from Shona Artery to attend the launching of the 2016 IPROWD program. The Australian Government, the NSW Police Force, TAFE NSW and Charles Sturt University are working in Partnership to offer IPROWD training programs across NSW which will assist Aboriginal people to gain entry into the NSW Police Force.

This year, our very own Shona Artery has won a place in this very prestigious and highly contested program. She is one of only eleven successful applicants who have begun the course this year. The course forms part of her HSC studies and has very high expectations of behaviour and attitude for success. Shona will have all the support that our school and her family can provide to give her every chance of success. Congratulations Shona, we are so proud of you.

iKi Workshop

Our iKi leaders participated in a training session this week to further develop their skills in leading their peers through the iKi welfare and fitness program. Hearing Bus

Based in Dubbo, the Hearing Bus provides free ear health education, hearing tests and access to ear specialists for children in Dubbo and surrounding Districts.

Years 7 & 8 History Field Study Excursion

Next week, our Year 7 & 8 students will be participating in an excursion to Dubbo as part of their History studies. Please make sure that all permission notes are returned promptly to the school. This is a mandatory activity and is part of the History Curriculum.

Rotary Youth Driver Awareness

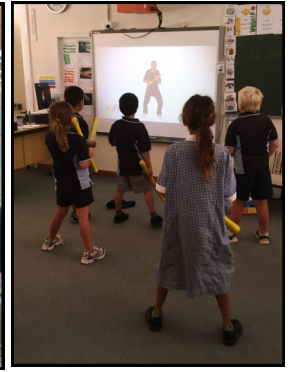
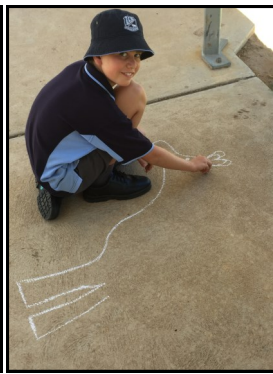
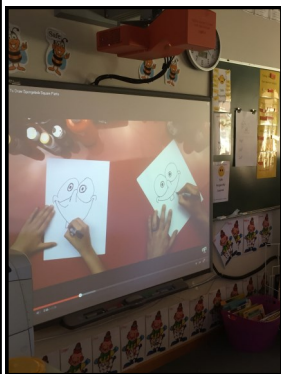

Jake – I like going up and down the tyres and doing maths.

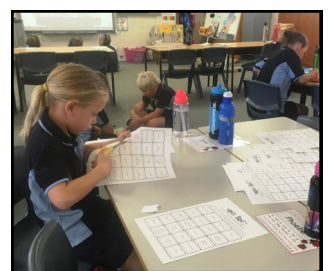
Christian – I like interest groups with Miss Druce we do cartoon drawing. I like going to the library and computers.
