Mathematics and Music – a magic combination

As a mathematician and also a musician, I am most certainly biased, but I have always believed that participation in music leads to success in Mathematics – or is it the other way around? There is actually evidence to support the view that learning to read music leads to improved ability to recognise patterns, to concentrate and to commit to and work towards a goal. With this fundamental belief in the importance of both Music AND Mathematics, we have sought and successfully gained the appointment of a Mathematics graduate and a Music graduate for 2019. We are very excited at the injection of new and youthful ideas that both these appointments will bring.

This commitment to both Mathematics and the Creative and Performing Arts reflects the dual focus at our school of academic excellence and the development of creativity in our students. Students have the opportunity to participate and excel in a program of dance, Music and Visual Arts and this is proving to be a very powerful combination that promotes mental health and wellbeing. Being creative is good for the soul and when you feel good, you learn well.

The power of the Central School is that primary students benefit from the presence of secondary specialist teachers not available in a straight primary school. Next year, our primary students will once again have access to a music professional and I am optimistic that we will have a choir starting in 2019! We have some wonderful singers coming out of the Moorambilla program and I have high hopes of building on this at TCS. Watch this space.

Respite Centre Opening

After a huge amount of work and support from our community we are thrilled to announce a date for the official opening of the Trangie Respite Centre. The Respite Centre is already providing opportunity for overnight respite for our community and has already created employment. This has been a massive job, particularly for Mike and Chris Welch and they need to be congratulated for what has resulted in a fantastic asset for our town.

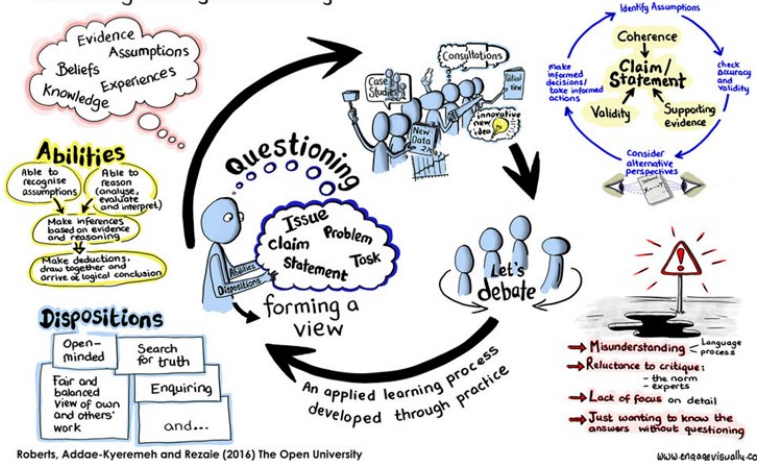

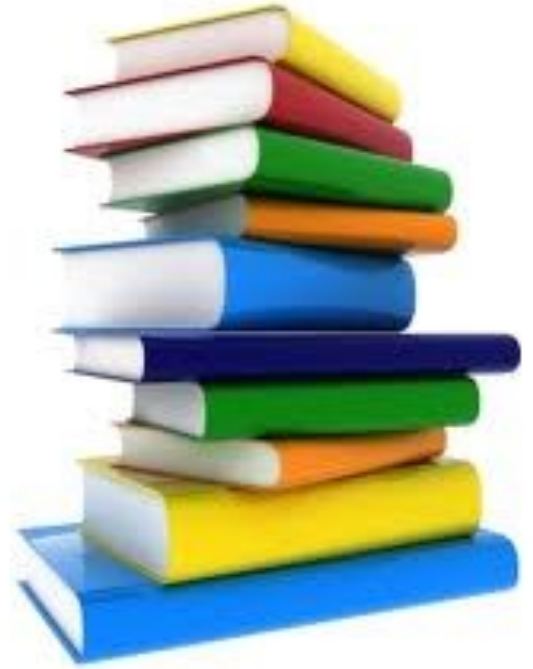

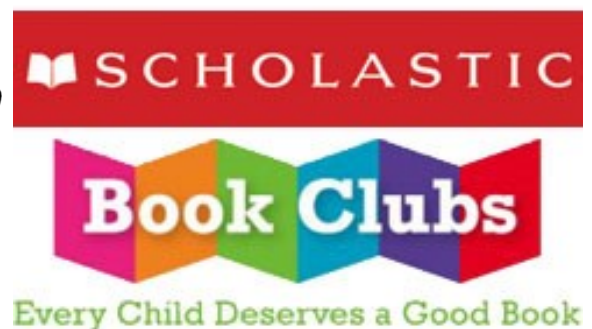


Best Borrows
