Are You OK?

Last week I expressed my concerns regarding social media and the role that FaceBook, Snapchat etc play in bullying and the dissemination of inappropriate materials such as explicit photos. Students continue to get involved in such activities, regardless of the warnings they are given about the risks to themselves and others. We will be enlisting the services of our Police Liaison Officer again to deliver his message to our students to try and get them to understand.

As parents, please be vigilant regarding your son or daughter's phone usage and make sure you are fully aware of their activities. We ban phone usage at school, but after-hours use has a huge flow on effect in school on student mental health. Please keep an eye on your child and let us know if you think he or she is receiving inappropriate messages. We hope that students will also look out for each other and tell someone if there is cause for concern.

The People Matter Employee Survey

At TCS we take staff welfare as seriously as we do student welfare. It is essential for a harmonious and productive environment that we care for each individual.

Each year we participate in the *People Matter Employee Survey* so that we can ascertain the health of our organisation. I need to make sure that I do not live in a happy little bubble that has no realistic notion of how the staff feel about our school and our management of it. The results on the right show that our ratings for High Performance are excellent. This makes me very proud.



I am consistently proud of how our staff operate. They give 100% and it is a privilege to work with them. Our students benefit from teachers who give unstintingly of themselves to provide endless opportunities outside the classroom and quality teaching within the classroom. The result on the right from the student *Tell Them From Me Survey* is evidence of the success of high performing teachers which has resulted in students rating positively about effective learning time, higher than the NSW Government Norm AND trending upwards – and that is what it is all about, isn't it!

Finally

My door is and always has been open – whether you are happy, sad or mad. I need to know if we are not doing something right but I also need to know that you trust our motives and our intentions. I do teach, so if you need to talk to me for any reason, just call the office and arrange a time that I am not on class or in a meeting. Also, don't forget our suggestion box at each side of the school.

Everything we do, every single day is for YOUR children. If we can do it better, tell us. Facebook is for cowards – so please tell us to our face!

Also, give your child the most valuable gift in the world – a good education – so send them EVERY day. We have a great school and it is such good value for very little money.

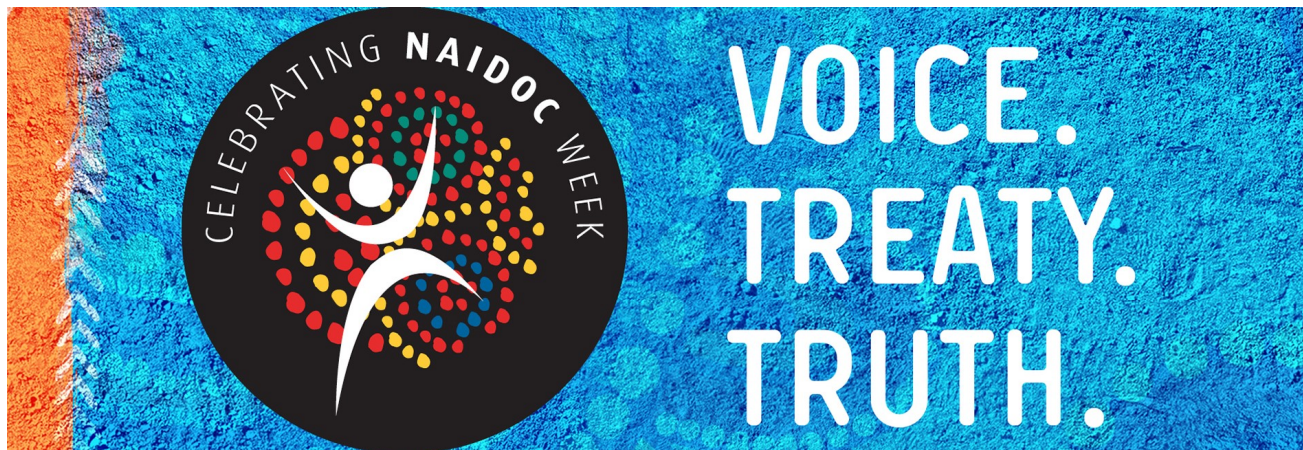

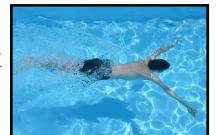

Improve your child's creative writing in 10 minutes per day!

The ability to write well is vitally important to your child's success in life. Writing well can help your child succeed academically and professionally. Moreover, creative writing can be an important therapeutic outlet for your child to imagine new worlds and to express his or her feelings. Help your child improve their creative writing skills by supporting creativity, by playing word games, and sparking their imagination with clever writing prompts.

Create time for reading and writing. Make sure your child's schedule isn't packed with other activities. Reading and writing take a lot of time and mental energy, so you cannot expect your child to write a story in between soccer practice and piano lessons. Let your child explore the world of words during times when they can relax, breathe, contemplate, and think freely.

Aurora College offers students expanded career options through innovative partnerships with businesses and with scientific, cultural and tertiary education institutions.

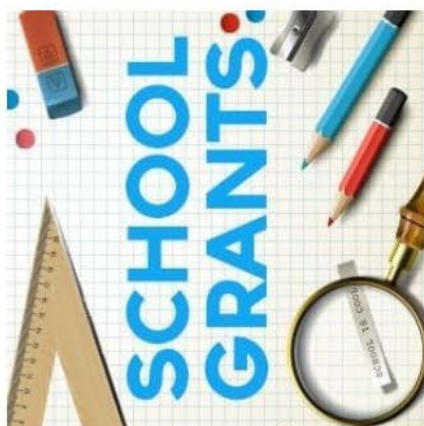
Students in the selective stream are chosen in the same way as students in all other selective classes in NSW government schools.

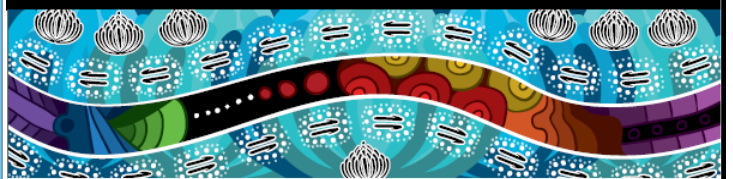
