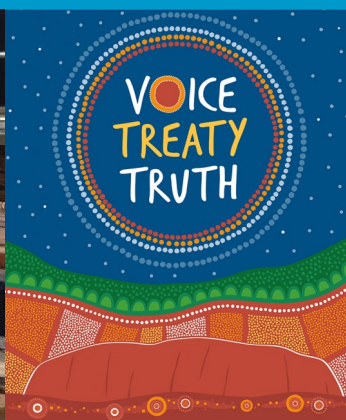

Head Teacher's Report

Last week students, families and community members were treated to a vast array of cultural activities which bring about awareness, learning and appreciation of Aboriginal culture. Well done to everyone who braved the elements and attended the Trangie Community Corroboree at the Wungunja Cultural Centre. From all accounts it was a great success, and followed on from a fantastic NAIDOC celebration at school Thursday. I hope everyone is recovering from Friday's terrible dust storm.

Yesterday saw our final Year 6 Transition session for 2019. Students had the opportunity to experience life in High School, and our cohort was treated to a day of interesting and varied lessons. First Mate Holden led his class into a Scratchy ship-shape maze. My class dissected flowers and marvelled at how delicate, intricate and complex flower parts really are when viewed under a microscope! Miss Press wrote poems in a Black Out, while Mrs Anderson made yummy jam tarts in Food Technology.



Year 8 students are reminded that next week they will be taking the VALID test. This on-line test is like NAPLAN but for Science and is **COMPULSORY** for all Year 8 students in NSW. It tests how well they can apply scientific concepts to real-life scenarios. We have been conducting this test for Years 6 and 10, so we have a good record of how students are progressing in Science across 5 years of school. Parents of Year 8 students will receive a progress report from NESA later in the year.

And don't forget dress up for tomorrow's Halloween Trick or Treat event. This event raises funds to support students to travel to School Spectacular. It's creepy and it's kooky, mysterious and spooky... and a heap of fun for a worthwhile cause!

NAIDOC Celebrations

Last week our school and community celebrated the culture, history and vitality of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. The NAIDOC team organised some excellent rotational activities for our students to participate in. These included creation and dreamtime stories, looking at artefacts and hearing about how they were used, visiting the Wungunja Cultural Centre and learning about the items on display and practising the local Wiradjuri language. It is always an interesting day for our students and each of us comes away having learned new things.

On Friday, all of the Primary students spent an hour over at the Wungunja Cultural Centre. There were some visiting guests from all over NSW who came to share their special skills with our community. We learned how to weave grass to create string for jewellery, we participated in indigenous games, learned about native plants and why they are so important in our ecosystem and there was a troupe of male dancers who taught the children some cultural dances.

A special congratulations to Tiffany Brezzo and Christian O'Neill who joined some secondary singers to perform a beautiful song for the community at the Corroboree on Friday evening. Christian, Tiffany and Noah Clarke also joined in with some dancing when invited. The evening was a lovely way for the community to spend time together and focus on unity, respect and treating each other with kindness. Well done to our students for being keen to get involved.

Sporting Schools Grant



Sporting Schools is a \$240 million Australian Government initiative designed to help schools to increase children's participation in sport, and to connect them with community sporting opportunities.

Sporting Schools programs are provided free to children and their families to help students build the confidence and capability to be active for life.

To help achieve this, Sport Australia has partnered with more than 30 national sporting organisations (NSOs). There is a program for primary schools, and a targeted program for Year 7 and 8 students in secondary schools.

We have successfully applied for another Sporting School's grant which has resulted in our students from K-6 being able to participate in free cricket lessons and skills development with a professional cricket instructor. The lessons begin this Friday and continue over the next six weeks. Cricket instruction will include strength and agility training, hand eye co-ordination, batting, throwing, catching and bowling skills.

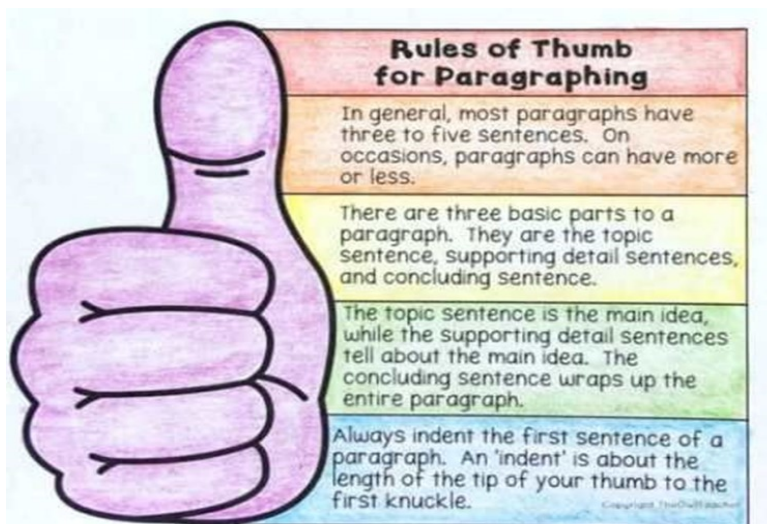


Improve your child's Creative Writing in 10 minutes per day!

The ability to write well is vitally important to your child's success in life. Writing well can help your child succeed academically and professionally. Moreover, creative writing can be an important therapeutic outlet for your child to imagine new worlds and to express his or her feelings. Help your child improve their creative writing skills by supporting creativity, by playing word games, and sparking their imagination with clever writing prompts.

Provide your child with a place and materials for creative writing. Just as children should have a quiet place to study and do their other homework, the same is true for their writing assignments. Ideally, this would be a desk in the child's room, away from the television. If your child wishes to have privacy, be sure that you afford that to them: do not read over their shoulder unless they say you can. A child's writing area should include the following materials:

- A notebook or journal
- Pens, pencils, and erasers
- A bookshelf to keep inspiration nearby
- An age-appropriate dictionary
- A thesaurus. A thesaurus isn't necessary for very young children, but it can be helpful for older children who wish to expand their vocabularies.
