We have two new staff members appointed to our school, Ms Emma Roberts (Music) and Ms Aimee Wall (Mathematics). School Equipment

School Expectations

Our school follows three main expectations across all classes and school areas. These are being SAFE, RESPECTFUL and being a LEARNER. Your child will have participated in discussions this first week about how this reflects in their classroom and across our school areas. We encourage you to continue this discussion with them at home. Another expectation of Trangie Central School is that we are KIND.

Canteen

Our canteen is open 5 days a week. Recess and Lunch orders must be completed by 10am. There are bags and menu supplied at school for your convenience. Students are not permitted to walk to the canteen to purchase food, it must be ordered. On Fridays we have recess on the High School side and they can bring money to buy food directly from the canteen. The Term One Canteen Menu is included in this newsletter.

School Student Banking Program

Student Banking day is Wednesday. Please bring your Commonwealth Bank book and hand to the classroom teacher. Our School Banking program is a fun way for your child to develop the knowledge and confidence to handle their money and to join in a Rewards Program with interesting activities throughout the year.

Uniform

Our school uniform must be worn every day and available for purchase at the High School Office.

Our School Policy includes school hats that are to be worn in Terms 1 and 4. The policy applies between 8:30am until the end of each day 3.00pm where any outdoor activity occurs. Hats are also available to purchase at the office. Students not wearing hats will sit outside in the shade or in the COLA area during recess or lunch break. Hats must also be worn for outdoor sporting events and excursions.

School Supplies

Students in Years 3- 6 are encouraged to bring a pencil case to school with supplies that include pencils, ruler, sharpeners etc. The school supplies these for students in K-2. The Primary Requirements list is included in this newsletter.

Homework

Each class participates in the Home Reading Program and this is the foundation of our homework. Teachers will also provide a Mathematics homework sheet.

Correct Shoes

These shoes are correct as they meet Workplace Health and Safety requirements, as well as uniform requirements. They are leather or equivalent impervious material, fully enclosed and are predominantly black. The set of black Volley's in these pictures have impervious uppers, making them acceptable.



Incorrect/Unacceptable Shoes

These shoes are not acceptable as they do not meet the Workplace Health and Safety requirements of being leather or equivalent material. The slipper style canvas shoes in the first picture are popular, but unacceptable against all school requirements. You may notice that the last set of shoes are black Volley's, however they have a soft canvas upper which makes them unsafe for our practical subjects.

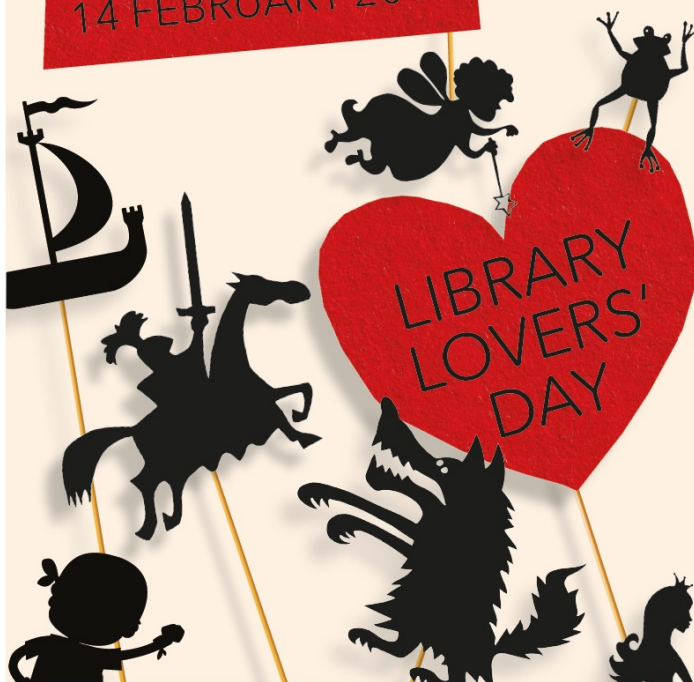

Teach your children well

On 19 August 2018, the Australian Government announced it would boost the Drought Communities Program by \$75 million and provide initial support of \$1 million to 60 eligible councils in 2018-19 to support local infrastructure and other projects for communities and businesses who have been impacted by drought. Narromine Shire Council has set aside \$110,000 of its allocation for community groups and organisations to apply for funds of up to \$20,000 to undertake capital works projects associated with their organisation.

Examples might include:

- Sports grounds – new fence;
- Club houses – WHS compliant kitchen or disabled toilets;
- Meeting rooms – painting rooms / purchase of furniture.

The objective of the Drought Communities Program is to deliver benefits in Declared Council areas, by supporting investment in local infrastructure initiatives. Funding will be targeted at infrastructure projects that provide employment for people whose work opportunities have been impacted by drought; stimulate local community spending; use local resources, businesses and suppliers; and/or provide a long-lasting benefit to communities and the agricultural industries on which they depend.
