

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Using Data with Confidence

One of the goals that we are working towards in our school plan is to better educate ourselves to be able to 'Use Data with Confidence'. In the modern world of education more and more we have to generate, analyse and then utilise the results of the data that we collect. We are inundated with information and there often seems to be so much that it is hard to know where to start. We have been very successful in the Tell Them From Me Surveys, measuring Wellbeing, Effort, Rigour and lots more. Comparing the trends from these over the years has been very useful in giving us feedback on the effectiveness of our Wellbeing programs. On the first day of Term 3, on Staff Development day, we will be having a representative from TTFM to take us through the surveys to show us how, for example we can use the surveys as evidence to measure how successful we have been in such areas as differentiation, extension, remediation, anti-bullying measures.

This week Susan Gotchall from the Centre for Statistical Evaluation (CESE) drove all the way to our school from Orange to give us an introduction into data analysis. I think many might think I am a little odd, because I thoroughly enjoyed the mathematics of it and found it fascinating. Excel spreadsheets were used to enter and analyse Central Tendency in the data and for some staff this was unfamiliar territory. Knowing how to analyse test results to inform teaching is something that is relevant for all teachers however, so the activity is going to be very valuable and well worth our while. In week 8 of this term we get the second instalment which I for one, am really looking forward to.

Signing in

Just a reminder for families and community members, even though this IS Trangie and we don't exactly have a huge fence (thank goodness) the safety and security of our students is still paramount. Please remember that it is Department of Education policy that all visitors to our school must present at the front office and sign in the visitors' book. No person should enter the school playground from any other entrance without this.

ICAS Competitions

Over the last few years schools have managed the ICAS tests, by taking payment, filling in paper forms and then posting them off. From this year, however, schools will no longer be responsible for this task and entry will need to be made by the parent online and then the test will also be delivered online. The window for applications will be from the end of May to July 31st. Information will be circulated as we receive it.

"I liked the face painting and I liked dressing up" - Mylee (Kinder)



"I like the indoor soccer" - Skyla (Year 1/2)



NAPLAN



This week, our students in Years 3 and 5 have been sitting their NAPLAN examinations. The children sit four tests: Language conventions, Writing, Reading and Mathematics. In writing this year, the children had to write a narrative with the stimulus paper having images of Gates. All students have applied themselves well. They have concentrated, used their time wisely and taken the tests seriously. Results are generally distributed to schools and families towards the end of Term 3. The following are the thoughts of some of our Year 5 students.....




"Personally, I do not like NAPLAN but I see why they do it...so they can test if teachers are teaching the kids right." - **Amelia Reisterer**


