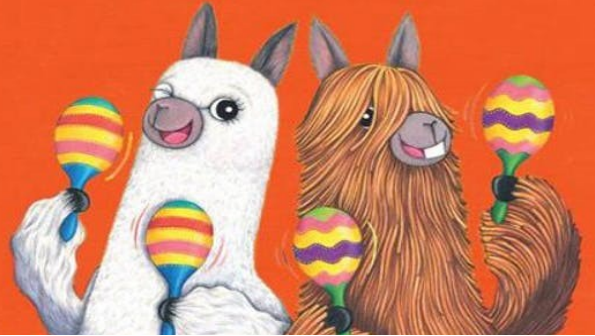

At TCS, every single member is respected for who they are and all backgrounds are valued equally. This is the reason why all our students stand tall and proud, knowing how much we care for and value each one of them.

Years 5-8 STEM Program

This week sees the completion of the latest STEM unit focussed on building structures which can withstand extreme conditions such as bushfire, cyclones and flooding. Students have worked very well over the last few weeks researching different designs and materials which would allow structures to be safe and resilient to these conditions, as well as learning to work in teams, and preparing a presentation to the whole STEM group about their completed model/prototype.

We are also lucky to have a team of engineers with us today, running workshops with the students around sustainable STEM ideas of renewable energy and clean water. They will also assist the teachers to evaluate and provide feedback to students regarding their latest projects. These engineers are part of the "Engineers without Borders" schools' outreach program, where they help students to develop an interest in the skills and knowledge related to engineering. This organisation has an overall focus of working in isolated and remote communities nationally and internationally, performing humanitarian projects and supporting local communities to be self-sufficient and "own" their own destiny.

Next week, students will kick off their new project on how to monitor and ensure rural communities keep their water clean and usable by overcoming challenging environmental factors, such as drought and salinity.

We are also aiming at increasing our STEM profile, with more stories of what we are achieving, including a STEM report for parents and acknowledging our STEM Stars each week. Watch this space!
