# FROM THE PRINCIPAL

*From the Principal – Hi Everyone, Welcome to Week 7*

## Transition for 2021

Yesterday was our first day of school transition for our new Kindergarten and Year 7 students for 2021. Unfortunately, we have had to leave the organisation for transition until now due to COVID-19 restrictions, but the Early Birds Program has certainly allowed most of our future Kindergarten students to become familiar with the school, routines and develop relationships with their friends as well as to get to know a few of our staff. Also, being a Central School environment, our Year 6 students are familiar with most of our teachers, especially with weekly STEM classes and accessing specialist subject areas, such as extension mathematics, visual arts and science, over the year. It was also great to meet and welcome our new students coming in from other schools, allowing them to get to know each other, become familiar with secondary school routines and seeing what they can look forward to in the coming year.

We also took the opportunity today of transitioning K-5 into their new classes for 2021, so that they knew where they would be and how their new classes would run. A reminder our next transition day is scheduled for next Wednesday.

## Year 12 Formal

Last week, we also transitioned our Year 12's of 2020 into the wider world of post-school with the Year 12 formal. As always, this event was fabulous, all but a bit tear jerky, as we farewell these young adults to follow their dreams after school. A big thank you to Mrs Seymour and her organising team for such a great night – Mrs Moss – what great inspirational decorating you do!

## Student Absences

It is a legal requirement that if a student is absent from school that a satisfactory explanation is provided by the student's parents or guardian; otherwise, the absence is considered unjustified. Each fortnight the attendance team looks at the absentee data and decide a course of action for students with attendance issues or reminders for those who have unjustified absences. To help remind parents to provide explanations, we have set up our school's attendance system, Sentral, to send a text message to parents if their child is absent. It would be appreciated if parents could reply to the message giving an explanation for the absence/s. This will help to reduce the number of unjustified absences that we need to follow up. Please ensure that the school has your most up to date details, especially your mobile phone number so that the messages will get through.

## New School Plan Cycle

We are starting to gain some good feedback from parents and community from our survey for our Situational Analysis, which will form the basis of our next school plan. Our aim this year of providing the survey by QR code was to get as many responses from the community as possible, rather than just targeting our parents. We also wanted the feedback to be as honest as possible, which is why there are no names attached to the replies.



I remind everyone that this survey is still open and if you would like to call the office instead of using the QR code to provide feedback, our friendly office staff will take your call. We also still have the suggestion box for feedback at any time.

## Finally.....

I would like to take a note from Mrs Holden's book and reiterate her message each week.....My door is and always has been open – whether you are happy, sad or mad. I need to know if we are not doing something right but I also need to know that you trust our motives and our intentions. ## UPDATE FROM GREEN THUMBS STEM GROUP

So far this term two groups of students have become Green Thumbs, applying Science to the propagating and growing of plants (Horticulture). In particular, we have a goal of setting up a productive Food Garden in the Ag Plot. This follows on from last term when they set up a Food Forest.

STEM students this term have tried a few horticulture techniques: soil preparation for planting vegetables, planting vegetable and herb seeds in beds and in pots, propagating from cuttings, transplanting seedlings, and working to keep plants thriving in the garden and the greenhouse. They have even included marigolds, basil, nasturtiums and other companion plants to attract beneficial insects. The most recent group took home their own transplanted flowering plants to grow or give away at home. So far each session has finished with a fruit platter feast (thanks to Lyn at the Canteen), with students imagining the harvest of fruits in future years from fruit trees recently planted in the Ag Plots.

Plans are to have more produce to harvest from the Food Garden in the future! As they say... "watch this (productive) space"!

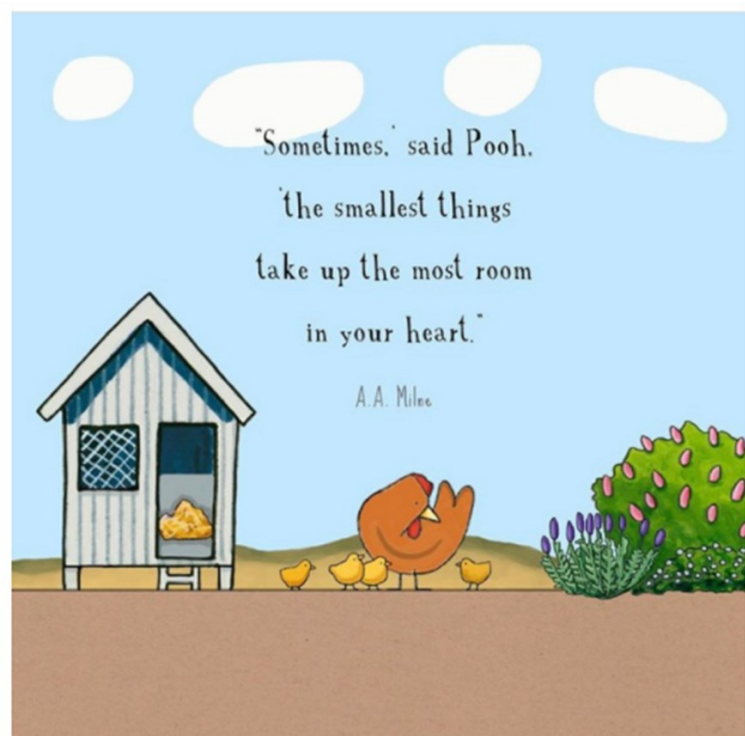

### Stage 5 Industrial Technology - Metals

Students have been working on a variety of projects in the metal workshop. Some have just completed folding shovels which have helped them develop a variety of fabricating and machining techniques. They used the lathe, learnt how to cut threads, further worked improving their welding skills, with some students even having a go at using the wood lathe to turn out a handle for their shovels. More recently we have been constructing rocket stoves which could be a useful camping accessory, and some students are fabricating bike stands to make maintenance that little bit easier. During theory lessons students have been investigating emerging technologies and automation, as well as the societal and environmental impact of the metal industry.

## Assistant Principal's Report

### School Swimming & Water Safety Program

This week has seen a number of our Primary students take to the water!



The Department of Education's 'School Swimming and Water Safety Program' is an intensive learn to swim program, which develops water confidence and provides students with basic skills in water safety and survival. The Program is conducted over eight days. Each daily lesson is 45 minutes.

Students who have not reached a satisfactory standard of water safety and survival skills, and are unable to swim 25m confidently unaided with correct technique in deep water, are eligible to participate in the School Swimming and Water Safety Program. The Program is open to public school students in Years 2 to 6.

The student's involved have been listening carefully and improving their skills day by day. Some have bravely faced their fear of water, whilst others have developed greater skills and stamina.



**To prevent drowning, all children involved in the program would greatly benefit from being involved in private lessons after school and also being taken to the pool regularly to swim with an adult.**



### Nervous Anticipation

Elections for Captaincy, involving speeches and voting, will take place next Tuesday morning the 1<sup>st</sup> of Dec. **Parents of year 5 nominees are welcome to attend** but due to Covid precautions, must sit 1.5m apart and sign in through the Primary Office.
