## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### Hi Everyone! It's so good to be back!

#### **Welcome Back Everyone**

It is great to be back on deck this week. We have certainly missed our students and colleagues over the last seven weeks. I am so glad that we were able to have a full return to school, where we can get back to our core business of face to face learning. It makes me proud to be able to say that we had on average over 60% of our students engage online over this period of time, as well as a good return of hard work packs from students who were not able to participate in this remote learning format. It is good to see a high percentage of K-11 students returning this week. Thank you to Mr & Mrs Fidock for their technology support for families and staff!

Over the next three weeks, we will be working towards our transition into the 2022 academic year for Years 1-11. We are currently planning and completing reports to move to this end goal of transition for Week 6. Planning for transition is also underway for Year 7 2022. It is important for those students coming from other schools that an enrolment form has been completed and submitted. More information and details regarding the transition will be communicated over next week.

We look forward to getting back to fairly normal routines, although there are certainly some restrictions which we still need to abide by to ensure the safety of all.

#### **Return to School Under Level 3 Restrictions**

I know there has been a lot of confusion and misinformation circulating, partly due to the rapid changes we find ourselves in, however we will endeavour to highlight important information on our Facebook page to keep you up to date. If you are confused or have questions, please contact the school and we will endeavour to find the answers.

It is great that we have been able to return to school under Level 3 restrictions, allowing K-12 to fully come back, not only a week earlier than expected, but also all at the same time. At the moment, the school is only open to essential visitors. This means that you need to contact the school before coming in. All visitors to the school site must QR code in and wear face masks. DET guidelines request that parents do not congregate at the school entrances and exits when dropping off and picking up students. It is mandatory that all 7-12 students wear facemasks inside and outside unless eating and exercising, and it is highly recommended that K-6 students also wear masks. We do have some disposable masks at school if students forget to bring their own. This rule also applies to bus travel. Parents and carers entering the school solely for the purpose of drop-off and pick-up of children are not required to check in from Friday 15th October.

All classrooms have hand sanitiser for students to use at the start of lessons and disinfectant wipes to clean computers and desks. We also have extra cleaning of classrooms and outside furniture. We need to make sure student cohorts are not mixed, so stage and class groups have been designated different areas across our playgrounds. Classrooms are also well ventilated and students are being spread out to support social distancing.

The canteen will be operational next week for lunch orders, unfortunately, there will be no over the counter service. Uniforms will need to be ordered over the phone and picked up after school hours. If students are feeling unwell or have flu like symptoms, they need to get COVID tested before coming back to school.

We are taking all recommended precautions to keep students safe, so it is essential that all students return to school as normal so that we can minimise impact on learning.

Although vaccinations are encouraged for students over 12 years of age, they are not mandatory. For more information please refer to the Department of Health website.

### **Ag Plot Abundance**

The aquaponic teams are preparing to harvest the rainbow trout who have been slowly growing in the aquaponics system since the beginning of the year. On Tuesday, Brodie and Will caught some of the trout to measure how long they have grown. The one in the photo is 27 centimetres in length. Once the temperature in the fish tank rises above 19 degrees, the fish begin to suffer, as they are a cold water species.

On Monday three yabbies with eggs were added to the yabby hatchery. Once the eggs have hatched, the grown crayfish will be removed and the aquaponics team will concentrate on growing out the baby yabbies until they are big enough to move outside to the grow beds.

One of the mulberry trees planted by Miss Bretag and her gardening group a couple of years ago, is starting to produce fruit. While there is not enough yet to make jam, we can look forward to more fruit in the coming years as the trees mature.

#### **NAPLAN 2021**



### Year 5/6 Passion Projects



Last term and continuing this term, Year 5/6 are participating in Passion Projects, an opportunity for them to take their own direction in their learning by focusing on a topic that is of high interest to them. The idea is based on Google's 20% Time, where Google allows employees to work on a project of their choice for one day a week, one that employees are passionate about and will hopefully result in advancing the company. The idea is simple: when people work on a topic that interests them, productivity increases. In our classroom students are taught how to choose an inquiry question that intrigues them and are learning how to investigate and research to find answers. Passion Projects occur once a week in our classroom and students are encouraged to be part of an interactive learning environment and integrate all aspects of their learning throughout this process. 

















Life Before Lockdown!

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

# NEW SENIOR SHIRTS

Dear Parents & Guardians,

Several parents have requested the P& C investigate an alternate, more practical shirt for Year 11 and 12. The SRC surveyed students from Year 9-12 regarding their opinion about the current white senior shirt. Most students did not like the colour, as it can be hard to keep white. It was suggested we change the shirt to navy and white, keeping the same design and fabric as the current K-10 shirt. Unfortunately, there will be a small increase in price for all T-shirts, which will be \$27 from Term 1, 2022.

The P&C viewed the purposed design change and voted in favour of changing the senior shirt. The shirt will be available for purchase from Week 6, Term 4 this year to the senior students starting their first year of the new compressed curriculum. The current Year 11 students, who are starting Year 12 in Term 4, will be able to wear the white shirt for the remainder of their schooling.

While no more white T-shirts will be ordered, there are still plenty in stock should students need to purchase a white shirt in the next year or so.
