# FROM THE PRINCIPAL

**Hi everyone, welcome to Week 10 and our final newsletter for 2021.**

What a year it has been. We have had some great successes and have pushed through very difficult times to make it to the end of 2021, it certainly is another year to remember. We have achieved a lot this year, despite the trying times, supporting students to achieve the best in their education. Some of these successes include speech programs, extra classroom support in the early years with Student Learning Support Officers, extension of the Instructional Leader across K-10 (supporting literacy and numeracy intervention and strategies), staff professional learning with Big Ideas in Numeracy, InitaLit and MiniLit (phonics based early instruction), technology accessibility for all students and moving to online platforms, completion of murals, the bee garden, implementation of Stage 6 compressed curriculum as well as a range of student intervention programs across the school. There are also a number of projects already in the pipeline for 2022.

## **Presentation Day**

Livestreaming will again be available for parents and family to view the ceremony. The livestream will not be recorded and we ask families not to take screenshots during the ceremony.

Like last year, we can only hope that we will be able to have a "normal" Presentation Day for 2022, where we can welcome back our families and community, who we are missing dearly at the moment.

## **Staffing for 2022**

We have some staff movement for 2022. I would like to thank Sue Brown, who is going back to her position at Dubbo College Delroy Campus, for her commitment to the Science faculty over the last year.
